

**Pupil Premium Grant****Heronswood Primary School Pupil Premium Allocation**

The Pupil Premium is allocated to schools for children of statutory school age from low-income families who are known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and to children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months and to children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

From the 2012-2013 financial year this included pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. We are requested to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.
